- \* Ten (10) year olds may try out for a Senior Little League team. A 10 year old who is not selected for a Senior Little League team will automatically be placed on a Junior Little League team
- \* Players that participated in Senior Little League in 2008 must register but need not attend the tryout
- \* Eleven (11) and twelve (12) year old players **ARE NOT** eligible for Junior Little League
- \* Senior Little League is privately funded and operated by the Napoleon Baseball Association
- \* Seven (7) year olds have an option of playing in Tee Ball (hit from tee using soft cover ball) or in Youth League (coach-pitch using hard baseball)
- \* Coaches will be contacting players in mid-April (Sr. & Jr. Lge) or mid-May (Yth. and Tee Ball Lge.)

## PARENTS CODE OF ETHICS

The National Alliance for Youth Sports, a nonprofit organization focused on Youth Sports ethics for coaches and parents developed a "Code of Ethics" for parents with children participating in recreation programs.

The Parks and Recreation Department staff, the Napoleon Baseball Association, and all of their volunteer supervisors and coaches ask that all parents read and adhere to the following ethics<sup>1</sup> during the upcoming season.

- *I will encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, and officials at every game, practice or other youth sports events.*
- *I will place the emotional and physical well-being of my child ahead of any personal desire to win.*
- *I will insist that my child play in a safe and healthy environment*
- *I will provide support for coaches and officials working with my child to provide a positive, enjoyable experience for all.*
- *I will demand a drug, alcohol, and tobacco-free sports environment for my child and agree to assist by refraining from their use at all youth sports events.*
- *I will remember that the game is for children and not for adults.*
- *I will do my very best to make youth sports fun for my child.*
- *I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials with respect regardless of race, sex, creed, or ability.*
- *I will promise to help my child enjoy their youth sports experience within my personal constraint by assist with coaching, being a respectful fan, providing transportation or whatever I am capable of doing.*

## PARK FACILITIES

**Oakwood Park** - Located on Oakwood Ave.; Four (4) youth baseball diamonds, batting cages, Basketball Court, restrooms, shelter houses, soccer field, beach volleyball court, lake for fishing, picnic areas, hiking trail, one mile walking path .

**Glenwood Park** - Located on Glenwood Ave.; 2 open shelter houses, youth baseball field, Olympic size swimming pool, 9 hole golf course, lighted basketball court, sand volleyball courts, picnic areas, grills, restrooms, skateboard ramp, and the **Kidz Kingdom Playground Complex**.

**Oberhaus Park** - Located on W. Maumee St.; Rotary-Lions Community Center, Public fishing, picnic areas, parking, open grassy areas, walking/bike path, boating and fishing dock.

**Ritter Park** - Located on W. Riverview Ave. (St. Rt. 424); Enclosed, heated shelter house (rental), restrooms, picnic tables, grills, playground equipment, shuffleboard court, volleyball court, horseshoe pits, skating pond, bike/walking trail.

**Boatrap Facility** - Located on W. Riverview Ave. (St. Rt. 424); Concrete ramp for launching boats on Maumee River, docks, open shelter house, restrooms, picnic areas, grills, playground equipment.

**Swearingen Park** - Located on the corner of Meekison and S. Perry Sts.; **New Skate Park**, basketball court, playground equipment, picnic areas.

**East Riverdowns Park** - Located off of E. Front St. and the corner of E. Main and Stout Sts.; 2 softball diamonds, picnic areas, grills, playground equipment, restrooms, shelter house, volleyball court, horseshoe pits, tree arboretum and nursery

**Meyerholtz Park** - Located on W. Riverview Ave. (St. Rt. 424); Open shelter, picnic areas, open grass area, bike/walking trail.

**Wayne Park** - Located on Wayne Park Dr.; Enclosed shelter (rental), picnic area, grills, horseshoe pits, playground equipment, restrooms, bike/walking trail.

**Vorwerk Park** - Located on St. Rt. 424 East; Picnic tables, grills, restrooms, hiking trails, fishing access.
